n 1723, the Delaware Indians settled Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania as a campsite halfway between the Allegheny and the Susquehanna Rivers. The town is 90 miles northeast of Pittsburgh, at the intersection of Route 36 and Route 119. The Delaware's considered groundhogs honorable ancestors. According to the original creation beliefs of the Delaware Indians, their forebears began life as animals in "Mother Earth" and emerged centuries later to hunt and live as men.

The name Punxsutawney comes from the Indian name for the location "ponksad-uteney" which means "the town of the sandflies. "The name woodchuck comes from the Indian legend of "Wojak, the groundhog" considered by them to be their ancestral grandfather.

When German settlers arrived in the 1700s, they brought a tradition known as Candlemas Day, which has an early origin in the pagan celebration of Imbolc. It came at the mid-point between the Winter Solstice and the Spring Equinox. Superstition held that if the weather was fair, the second half of Winter would be stormy and cold. For the early Christians in Europe, it was the custom on Candlemas Day for clergy to bless candles and distribute them to the people in the dark of Winter. A lighted candle was placed in each window of the home. The day's weather continued to be important. If the sun came out February 2, halfway between Winter and Spring, it meant six more weeks of wintry weather.

The earliest American reference to Groundhog Day can be found at the Pennsylvania Dutch Folklore Center at Franklin and Marshall College:

February 4, 1841 - from Morgantown, Berks County (Pennsylvania) storekeeper James Morris' diarry..."Last Tuesday, the 2nd, was Candlemas day, the day on which, according to the Germans, the Groundhog peeps out of his winter quarters and if he sees his shadow he pops back for another six weeks nap, but if the day be cloudy he remains out, as the weather is to be moderate."

According to the old English saying:

If Candlemas be fair and bright, Winter has another flight. If Candlemas brings clouds and rain, Winter will not come again.





Background

The origins of Valentine's Day are not clear. It is thought that there were a number of local fertility festivals in Europe in pre-Christian times. These were often in the middle of February. Many people also thought that birds chose their mates at this time of year. Around the year 1380, the English poet Chaucer wrote a poem for the first anniversary of the engagement of King Richard II to Anne of Bohemia. This is thought to be the first association between celebrations of romantic love and St Valentine's Day on February 14. The connection remained important throughout the middle ages.

In the mid-19th century, there was an increase in interest in Valentine's Day, first in the United States, then in Canada. It was promoted by manufacturers of paper lace and cards as a means of increasing their sales. Gradually, this date was seen as an occasion for a man to present gifts to a woman with whom he had or would like to have had a romantic relationship. It was also customary for lovers to exchange handwritten notes. These have now largely been replaced by commercially produced cards.

Public Life


Valentine's Day is not a public holiday. Schools, businesses, organizations, post offices and stores are open as usual. Public transport services run to their usual timetables. Restaurants and hotels may be busy as many people take out their partner for a romantic meal or night away in a hotel.

What Do People Do?

Many people send letters, cards, presents and gifts to the person with whom they have or want to have a romantic relationship. Valentine's Day cards are often red or pink and decorated with images of hearts, red roses, teddy bears, presents or happy couples kissing or embracing. They may be in brightly colored, perhaps pink or red, envelopes.

Many people give gifts to loved ones on Valentine's Day. Common gifts are:

- Flowers, particularly red roses.
- Chocolates and/or candy.
- Teddy bears.
- Toy hearts.
- Sparkling wine.
- Cosmetics.
- Clothing, including lingerie.
- Jewelry.



Valentine's Day can also be an occasion for a more general celebration of love and appreciation of people who are personally important to an individual. School children may help decorate their classrooms with hearts and spring birds and make cards or presents for their parents. Stores may also sell Valentine's Day themed cakes, cookies or candy. Teenagers and young adults may hold Valentine's Day parties or dances on or near February 14.


Yard Sale - Again we are going to do a sidewalk sale. If, when you are spring cleaning, you find items to donate, set them aside and we will welcome all donations!!!

Slow Cooker Sweet and Spicy Asian Pork Shoulder

INGREDIENTS

- 1. **1/2**cup low-sodium soy sauce
- 2. **1/2**cup brown sugar
- 3. **1 to 2**tablespoons chili-garlic sauce (found in the Asian aisle of the supermarket)
- 4. **1**tablespoon grated fresh ginger
- 5. **1**teaspoon Chinese five-spice powder (optional)
- 6. kosher salt and black pepper
- 7. **2 1/2** pounds pork shoulder, trimmed of excess fat and cut into 2-inch pieces
- 8. **1**cup long-grain white rice
- 9. **1**medium head bok choy, thinly sliced (about 8 cups)
- 10. **2**scallions, sliced

- Hands-On Time 15 min
- Total Time 8 hrs





DIRECTIONS

- 1. In a 4- to 6-quart slow cooker, combine the soy sauce, sugar, chili-garlic sauce, ginger, five-spice powder (if using), ½ teaspoon salt, and ¼ teaspoon pepper. Add the pork and toss to coat. Cook, covered, until the pork is tender, on high for 4 to 5 hours (this will shorten total cooking time) or on low for 7 to 8 hours.
- 2. Twenty-five minutes before serving, cook the rice according to the package directions.
- 3. Meanwhile, skim off and discard any fat from the pork. Gently fold the bok choy into the pork and cook, covered, until heated through, 2 to 4 minutes. Serve with the rice and sprinkle with the scallions.

Quick Chocolate Coca-Cola Cake Recipe

INGREDIENTS

- 1-18 ounce chocolate cake mix
- 3 eggs
- 1/3 cup vegetable oil
- 1-1/4 cups Coca-Cola* soda
- ----Frosting----
- 6 tablespoons butter
- 1/2 cup cocoa
- 1/4 teaspoon salt1 pound box <u>powdered sugar</u>
 - 5 tablespoons Coca-Cola soda 1 cup <u>lightly toasted</u> nuts**, optional





Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Grease 9x13 baking pan. Combine cake mix ingredients. Mix with electric mixer for 2 minutes. Pour into pan. Bake for 29-24 minutes.

Frosting:

Cake

While cake is baking, combine frosting ingredients in top of <u>double boiler</u>. Stir occasionally until completely combined and melted. Remove cake from oven to wire cooling rack. Spoon frosting over warm cake. Spread quickly before frosting hardens.

Allow to completely cool before serving.

Shrimp and Corn Chowder With Fennel

Ingredients

- 1. 2tablespoons unsalted butter
- 2. 2leeks (white and light green parts), chopped
- 3. Ifennel bulb, chopped
- 4. kosher salt and black pepper
- 5. 2tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 6. 18-ounce bottle clam juice
- 7. 3cups whole milk
- 8. 1 pound potatoes, peeled and cut into 1/2-inch pieces
- 9. 3/4pound cooked peeled and deveined medium shrimp
- 10. 110-ounce package frozen corn
- 11. 2tablespoons chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley
- 12. 2tablespoons fresh lemon juice

bread, for serving (optional)







DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Heat the butter in a large saucepan over medium heat.
- 2. Add the leeks, fennel, ½ teaspoon salt, and ¼ teaspoon pepper. Cook, stirring occasionally, until the vegetables are tender, 4 to 5 minutes. Stir in the flour.
- 3. Add the clam juice, milk, and potatoes and bring to a boil.
- 4. Reduce heat and simmer, stirring occasionally, for 12 minutes.
- 5. Stir in the shrimp and corn and cook until the potatoes are tender and the shrimp and corn are heated through, 3 to 5 minutes.
- 6. Stir in the parsley and lemon juice. Serve with the bread (if using).


Movie Review
